

Options for Upgrading your Drupal 7 or Drupal 8 Site

Drupal 8 end-of-life is November 2, 2021 — Drupal 7 end-of-life is November 28, 2022

If you are currently on Drupal 8

- 1. The upgrade process from Drupal 8 to Drupal 9 is relatively easy.
- 2. You should utilize the Upgrade Status module https://www.drupal.org/project/upgrade_status to get a sense of what modules have a Drupal 9 version available and what changes to custom code will need to be made.
- 3. The number of contributed modules without a Drupal 9 version and amount of custom code will be the biggest factors of complexity.

Upgrade Options

Move to Drupal 9

- 1. This is the most complex option and likely requires a full rebuild.
- 2. If you want to take advantage of innovation in the past couple versions of Drupal, then you might want to consider this route.
- 3. If you are interested in the longevity of your site, and you want to stick with Drupal, this is your best move.
- 4. "The last major upgrade".

Drupal 7 Vendor Extended Support

- 1. Not a lot of information yet, but will likely be similar to the Drupal 6 program.
- 2. A group of approved and vetted vendors will continue to provide security updates for Drupal 7 core and certain contrib modules under the Drupal 7 Vendor Extended Support program.
- 3. Updates will be made available for free as they are released.
- 4. Does not solve the issue of PHP 7 becoming end-of-life in November 2022 as well. Drupal 7 and contributed modules will need to become PHP 8 compatible.

Move to Backdrop CMS

- 1. Backdrop CMS is a fork or a modified version of Drupal 7.
- 2. Backdrop has a built-in upgrade path from Drupal 7. Backdrop will be familiar to people with Drupal experience because it is so similar to Drupal, but includes numerous usability improvements and new features.
- 3. Backdrop will prioritize backward compatibility with Drupal 7 until at least 2024. A large selection of widely used Drupal 7 modules are already available for Backdrop, and more are on the way.
